



ACCSA Seated Zoom Lecture Education Tiers and Pricing

Seated Zoom Lecture option gains candidates access to the Online Distance Learning Portal with all study material for registered courses and packages. In addition, Candidates can attend the seated Zoom Lectures which run throughout the year at dates suitable to them. Candidates can register at any time (Please see upcoming dates for lectures), study at their own pace and take their exams when ready.

ACCSA Courses and Certifications are divided into three "Tiers" or levels ranging from smaller NAADAC approved CEU/CPD course modules up to international certifications. Below you will find the list of courses and certifications we currently have on offer, but this list will change and be updated in the future.

The First Tier - Courses - Page 2

The First Tier covers all addiction related topics to suit the needs of any student, whether only interested in specific topics, or for those wanting to further their education in progressing towards any international addiction certification. If you are looking for individual courses for CPD or just to broaden your knowledge on specific topics, the First Tier is for you.

The Second Tier - Packages - Page 4

The Second Tier are specialized packages or multiple course bundles at a reduced rate, suited to specific needs of the candidate. Whether interested in addictions counselling, general addiction related information, or any other related to the addiction field. The Second Tier is for those either studying towards IC&RC international certification examinations in the Third Tier, or just candidates interested in studying multiple courses in a more cost-effective way.

The Third Tier - International Certifications - Page 5

The Third Tier are the IC&RC Internationally recognized and accredited addiction certifications that most addiction professionals strive towards when specializing in the addiction field. ACCSA facilitates the application process and facilitates the examinations as a registered provider for ISO Quality Testing USA. When candidates meet the application criteria (see "The Process of Accreditation" below), they can start the registration process with us.

The Process for Certification

The process in achieving international accreditation is to accumulate both education credit and experience in the addiction field specifically. The international addiction counsellor's certification (CADC) in our Third Tier for example, requires 300 CEU/CPD Hours addiction specific education (Our complete package), and 6000Hrs (3Years) supervised experience in the addiction field. If you already meet these criteria, you may apply for the international examination. If not, you can start either with our First Tier doing courses individually or take packages in the Second Tier (recommended).

What is CEU/CPD training?

Continuing professional development (CPD) or continuing education units (CEU) is the means by which people maintain their knowledge and skills related to their profession. CEU/CPD obligations are common to most professions. Many professions define CEU/CPD as a structured approach to learning to help ensure competence to practice, taking in knowledge, skills, and practical experience. CEU/CPD can involve any relevant learning activity, whether formal and structured or informal and self-directed.

A thorough understanding of addiction and the latest evidence-based practices for treatment is the hallmark of a qualified professional. The Alcohol & Drug Counsellor credential requires professionals to demonstrate competency through experience, education, supervision, and the passing of a rigorous examination. Education: Defined as formal classroom style education (workshops, seminars, online courses, institutes, in-services, and college/university work). Advanced Alcohol & Drug Counsellor (AADC)	Adopted in 1999, the Certified Advanced Alcohol & Drug Counsellor (CAADC) is one of the largest credentials in the field of addiction-related behavioural health care - totalling over 5,000 professionals worldwide. There are now 26 countries, U.S. states, and territories that offer a reciprocal CAADC credential. In its Occupational Outlook Handbook, 2010-11 Edition, the U.S. Department of Labour (DOL) has named substance abuse and behavioural disorder counsellors as one of the fastest growing professions. The number of substance abuse and behavioural disorder counsellors across the country is expected to grow by 21 percent by 2018. The career is attractive, due to stable salaries and prospects for advancement. The government report especially mentions the value of certification: "Becoming certified is voluntary but having certification may enhance one's job prospects." For the purpose of certification, a CPRC is defined as a person who has primary responsibility for clients to help gain access to needed resources in the community by assisting them in overcoming barriers and helping them bridge gaps between their needs and available resources for ongoing recovery. The CPRC is a motivator, confidant, advocate, role model, teacher, mentor, problem solver, resource broker, community organizer and lifestyle consultant. That means CPRCs ask questions, offer reflections, and hold clients accountable and capable of choosing what is best for them. CPRC's help those to become ready and willing to seek treatment as well as help someone explore their options for recovery or treatment. The CPRC may also participate as a part of the treatment team and will have the ability to participate in the recommendation of treatment needs of clients.
